10. Based on the social audit findings, please list down **policy level suggestions** that you would like be incorporated in the implementation of schemes that were audited.

### A. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)-

- The Department should take the initiative to create awareness programme at least once in a year regarding their entitlements, so that people are well aware of their entitlements.
- Since the education plays an important role for the betterment of the society, there should be adequate infrastructure, should make new benches and desk, should repair the roofs and floors, have good blackboards so that children can study and learn properly.
- Should form a new SMC in transparency manner and active roles and responsibilities according to the Right to Education Act, 2009
- State Government must issue an order to all schools to maintain all the records and update timely.
- > Should follow and implement Right to education Act, 2009
- > Should appoint qualify teachers.
- > Should provide sufficient textbooks and uniforms to the children.
- Should distribute all incentives like textbooks, uniforms etc. in a transparency manner.
- State Government must issue an order to all the government schools to avoid school fees from the Children of elementary education. It is a completely violation of RTE, Act.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain

## B. Mid Day Meal (MDM)-

- Since the Mid Day Meal is a very important scheme, SMC should take it very seriously. Children should get nutritious food to eat at school.Children in the village are not getting the quality food because the school provide same type of food ever day in the school and since there are lots of seasonal fruits available in Garo Hills, children should get fruits as a part of MDM as it is their entitlements.
- State Government must issue an order to all schools that menu must be display publicly in the school and the cook should follow the menu. So that children will get varieties of food in the school.
- State Government must issue an order to all schools to maintain all records and update timely.
- Honorarium of the cook should be regular as the cooks do not get regular money and it should be increase as Rs 1000 is very less for them too.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain.

## C. Public Distribution System (PDS)-

- The Department should take the initiative to create awareness programme at the village level regarding their entitlements, so that people will be aware of their entitlements.
- There should be a separate Fair Price Shop (The Concerned dealer sold at his respective home) and the price list should be display publicly.
- > PDS dealer should maintain their register for every month clearly.
- The concern dealer should also aware of the entitlements and sales rice, sugar and kerosene accordingly.
- The dealer should display the category wise beneficiaries list at the Fair Price Shop for the purpose of transparency
- The Food and Supply department should take a decision for supply cost of food grain and also make a proper check and balance system for dispatch and receiving of food grain form FCI to Fair Price Shop.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain.

## D. Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS)-

- Since the villagers were not aware of their entitlements, Anganwadi worker should call for the general meeting quarterly, so that people will be aware of their entitlements.
- > ICDS centre should look attractive and wall paintings should be there.
- ICDSS centre should provide non- formal education so that more children will come and participate.
- Morning snacks and afternoon lunch should be provided every day to the children and should provide take home ration accordingly to the children and the Pregnant Women and Young mothers.
- ICDS centre should have separate kitchen to cook meals and room to store the food grains.
- > ICDS should have adequate infrastructure (Water and sanitation)
- > Should maintain all records properly.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain

## E. Health Department: Janani Suraksha Yojana (JSY) & JSSK-

- Based on the findings during Social Audit, most of the people were not aware of their entitlements. Therefore, they should create awareness programme in the village.
- The people of the village should appoint new ASHA in Chotcholja Village. So that she can do her responsibilities better.
- > New VHSNC should form.
- > VHSNC should organise VHND once in a month.
- > Should maintain all records properly.
- Must ensure proper monitoring at the sub centre level from the concern authority.
- Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain.

## F. National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP)-

Most of the people were not aware of their entitlements. So, the Department should provide awareness programme in each village.

- > Beneficiaries should get regular pension.
- > The entire beneficiary's list name must be display at the community centre.
- > All eligible beneficiaries must include in CM pension scheme.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain

## G. Public Health Engineering Dept. (PHE)-

- > The GI pipelines should be well connected to every nook and corner.
- The water supply should be regular
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain.

## H. Border Area Development Programme (BADO)-

- The quality of road constructed under Border Area Development Programme (BADO)in the village is not good. Therefore, the engineer of BADO should detail to conduct enquiry.
- > Should make an MIS and it should be in a public domain.
